Mission Statement

Vision Statement

Through best teaching practices and a commitment to school wide positive behaviour supports, the staff of Bernie Wolfe Community School will provide appropriate educational opportunities for all students in an environment that fosters belonging, welcoming, caring and succeeding.

PRIORITY AREA #1 – Curriculum – Assessment for Learning (7 steps)

1. By November 30, 2011, the students will demonstrate an understanding of SMART goals through the creation of two or more SMART goals based on their self-assessments in each curriculum area.
2. By September 2012 all students will begin to collect evidence of learning in a portfolio. This portfolio will have a common purpose across the grades.
3. By March 30, 2013 all students will have shared the contents of their portfolio with a meaningful adult as part of the parent-teacher-student conference cycle.

PRIORITY AREA #2 – Curriculum – Differentiated Instruction and Adaptations

1. By March 30, 2012 all students will be able to use their awareness of their personal multiple intelligence strengths and weaknesses to demonstrate their learning using at least three different modalities including at least one non-preferred modality in each curriculum area.

PRIORITY AREA #3 – Curriculum – Numeracy

1. By June 30, 2012, 85% of all Kindergarten, Grade 1 and Grade 2 students will be meeting grade level numeracy outcomes.

PRIORITY AREA #4 – Learning and Behaving

1. By June 30, 2012, 85% of all students will experience and exhibit the values Belonging, Welcoming, Caring, and Succeeding across various environments in the school.
