



ARTHUR DAY CODE OF CONDUCT

IN LUNCH ROOM

- Students are to clean up after themselves.
- Students are to vacate the upstairs by 11:55 a.m. unless supervised by a teacher
- Students are to remain seated until dismissed by supervising teacher at the 11:55 Transition Bell.
- Options for students are: Library, Gym (as a participant), Outside, or whatever planned activities are available that day.
- Once an option has been chosen, students are to stay in that area until 12:29. They should have all outside clothing with them as there is no hallway traffic upstairs.
- If a student is asked to leave an option area for behaviour reasons, he/she will be sent to the office.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR OUTSIDE

- No smoking on/or within sight of school property.
- Bikes, skateboards, scooters, wheelies and rollerblades are not to be used on school property at any time.
- Wrestling, fighting or rough play is **not** allowed on school property.
- No throwing snow or rocks.
- Students should be dropped off / picked up in designated areas only. The parking lot is for staff and divisional vehicles only.
- If students choose to go outside they are to remain outside until 12:29 p.m.
- No playing around the entrance/exits.
- Garbage belongs in the garbage cans, not on the school grounds.
- Students are asked to respect the neighboring properties and not gather in their yards.
- Students are to leave the flag pole alone.
- If students leave the school grounds to visit the local business establishments, behavioural expectations are the same as at school. **Students are expected to purchase their product and make their way back to school grounds. No loitering in the community.**

All students are given the privilege of staying for lunch at school or returning home for lunch. We will be operating on a 3 strikes system for minor infractions.

1. We will issue a warning to the student.

2. Issue a warning accompanied with a note home or phone call to parents regarding student's conduct.

3. **Suspension from lunch program.** (This will automatically apply for serious infractions)

Because of the large volume of students remaining for lunch, these guidelines must be adhered to for the safety and comfort of all. Students failing to comply will experience the above consequences.
