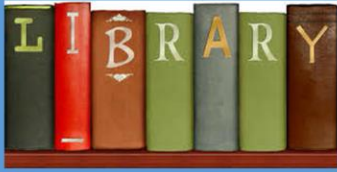

The inspiration for **ORANGE SHIRT DAY** came from residential school survivor-Phyllis Webstad.

Phyllis told the story of her first day of residential schooling at six years old, when her new orange shirt—bought for her by her grandmother—was taken away from her. Today, ORANGE SHIRT DAY exists as a legacy for residential school survivors, and the 30th of September, the annual date of the event, signifies the time of year when Indigenous children were historically taken from their homes to residential schools. In addition to simply wearing an orange shirt, Canadians are encouraged to learn more about the history of residential schools, their assimilation practices, and the impact they still have today.

**So yes, on September 30, please wear an ORANGE SHIRT, but even more importantly, LEARN about WHY you are wearing it.**
