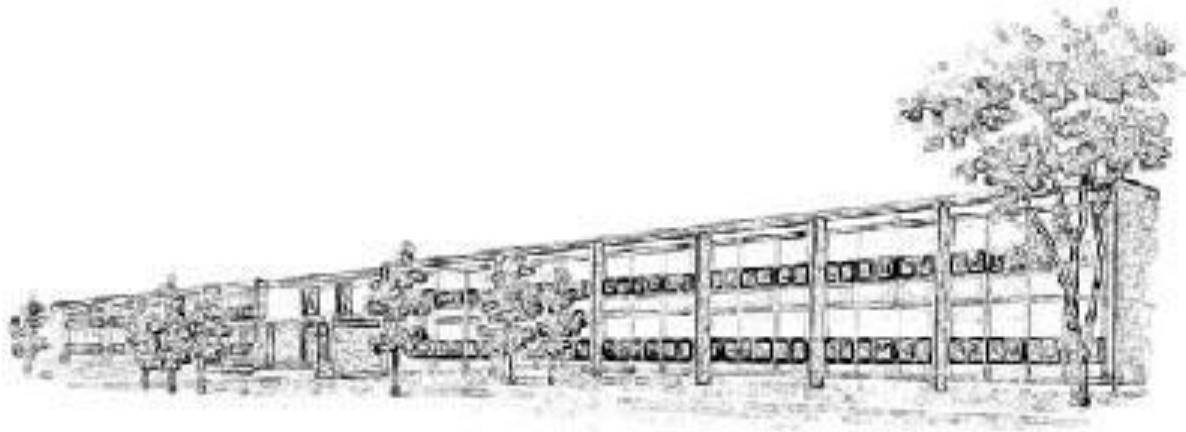

About Us:

River East Collegiate was built in 1960 and is a secondary school in the River East Transcona School Division that offers classes for students in grades 10 through 12.

River East Collegiate is located in an urban area serving the community of North Kildonan, East St. Paul and St. Clements. The student body and community are highly involved in all aspects of the school supporting a strong academic focus and an extensive co-curricular and extra-curricular program.

Enrollment for 2012-2013 was 940 students. River East Collegiate staff consists of 57 teachers 3 administrators, and 28 support staff. Our school is organized in departments and there are 7 teachers who serve as Department Heads. There are 140 courses offered at River East Collegiate this year and over 320 sections.

Students at River East Collegiate can select a course study from six streams.

REGULAR ACADEMIC

The academic program at River East Collegiate provides a strong foundation for students, whether they choose to go on to university, community college, or directly to the work place after graduation.

From among the core subjects of English, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies students may choose a program of studies appropriate to their abilities, interests and post graduation plans.

To complete their requirements for high school graduation students at River East Collegiate have a variety of electives to choose from. Some electives include: Art, Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Computer Science, Dramatic Arts, Family Studies, French, Geography, German, History, Human Ecology, Industrial Technology, Music, Physical Education, Physical Science, Physics, Psychology, Skills for Independent Living and Spanish plus electives from Technology Education.

TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION

Technology Education offers students an opportunity to graduate with a Business Education Technology Diploma or a Software Technology Diploma. Students have the opportunity to develop computer skills in courses designed to provide access to students at any level of computer awareness.

DUAL DIPLOMA

Students have the opportunity to graduate with a regular high school academic diploma that meets university entrance requirements plus a Business Education Technology Diploma or a Software Technology Diploma.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

This program is intended for gifted and highly motivated students. The course curriculum in grade 10 and grade 11 is accelerated to prepare students for the Advanced Placement coursework and examination in grade 12. Successful completion of these examinations permits a student to obtain advanced placement and often credit in their selected subject area at many colleges and universities in North America and around the world. Advanced Placement courses offered are: Biology, Calculus AB, Chemistry, Computer Science, English Literature and Composition, European History, French Language, French Literature, German, Physics, Spanish.

CAREER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM (CIP)

CIP is a school to work transition program open to grade 12 students. Students complete their academic programs in April and then intern with a business partner until the end of June. A successful internship could lead to employment and/or entrance into university or community college.

MODERN LANGUAGES

Advanced Languages and Management Diploma

Students must complete standing in at least two languages other than English at the grade 12 level and register for Management 40S or World Issues 40S. Students will also complete an internship with a business partner in a location where the language of study is spoken.

English-German Bilingual Program

This program is a continuation of the divisional program offered in elementary and junior high. To enhance their fluency students take Social Studies in German.

French

French courses are designed to meet the needs of both Basic French and French Immersion students. Students may pick from the basic French courses or Advanced Placement options.

Spanish

Courses are offered at the beginner and advanced levels. This program is designed for students who have not previously studied Spanish.

INTERNATIONAL PERSPECTIVE

River East Collegiate recognizes itself as a learning community in a global context, connected to other learning communities around the world. Partner schools in Canada, Europe, Central America and Asia collaborate with River East Collegiate in various ways, including student/student exchanges, e-mail and Internet projects and the sharing of educational materials.

We also have an International Student program welcoming students from Brazil, Korea, Germany, Spain, France to study at River East Collegiate and live in our community. Participation in the International Student Program further supports our global learning initiatives.

River East Collegiate is also working with the Canadian Commission for UNESCO in Ottawa to establish a Canadian UNESCO schools network, linking it with 5600 schools in over 150 countries. The Associated School Network project will provide our students with the opportunity to develop partnerships with students around the world as they focus on becoming global citizens.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

The students at River East Collegiate have the opportunity to participate in a variety of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Both intramural and interschool athletic participation is offered. Co-curricular music opportunities include Jazz Band and Vocal Jazz, Wind Ensemble and Percussion Ensemble. Drama and Art provide performance opportunities special events throughout the year. The Student Council acts as an advocate for student activities and events and as a liaison with the school administration. Student representatives work throughout the year to publish the school newspaper and an annual yearbook. Other school clubs include the Faith and Life Club and Key Club (student service club supporting both school and community projects). There are many other opportunities for students to participate in both curricular and co-curricular special events.

STUDENT ASSESSMENT

River East Collegiate practices fair and balanced assessment. Reporting to students and parents occurs three times each semester and student/parent/teacher conferences are held in conjunction with the first report each semester. Students in Grade 12 write Provincial standards tests in English Language Arts and Mathematics in January and/or June. Exams are administered in the subject areas at the end of each semester and constitute approximately 30% of the final grade.

SCHOOL PRIORITIES 2012 - 2013

1. Teachers will work on curricular mapping for all subject area courses.
2. Students will have the opportunity to participate in a technology based classroom project.
3. Students will be able to articulate what respect looks like in various areas of our school building and the community.
